Hey CBC Family,

As I'm grilling for Refresh while writing this, I am so humbled in thinking of the WAY bigger grilling job the priests used to have to do in the temple. And that job was not just cooking the meat, but also in preparing the sacrifice (I'm so glad "butcher" is not on my job description!) while also carefully cleaning everything up everything to a professional quality. However, that work which seems so foreign to us in that system was not just a must for them, but it was a sacred, desired task among the Levitical priests. Even now, Orthodox Jews cannot wait to sacrifice on the Temple Mount once again, as they've already developed a priesthood to do so. The priests of the Bible knew what represented, understood that it pleased the Heavenly Father, and saw that it was the necessary prescription for covering the sin guilt of the people. So, day in and day out, these faithfully carried on those messy duties for years and years to serve the people. It's amazing to think about, and my little off-the-grill night once a month certainly pales in comparison to.

Amazingly, of course, Jesus came to be the ultimate, once-and-for-all sacrifice for us (which certainly the priesthood sacrifices were pointing to that greater reality in Jesus). As Hebrews 7:25 reminds us, Jesus daily intercedes for us, as an intensely intentional, personal, and heavenly High Priest!

Last Days Bible Promise

Romans 8:38-39

In closing out this amazing chapter, verse 38 and 39 is the powerful evidence that explains why verse 37 is possible. How do we know than we are more than conquerors in Christ Jesus, as stated in verse 37? It is because Paul is fully convinced that absolutely nothing can separate us from the love of God, revealed in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Absolutely nothing? Yep! You and I know that "God SO LOVED the world that He sent His only Son that any who believes on Him could have everlasting life." (John 3:16) SO LOVED. I don't think we can overstate God's love. Paul certainly wasn't concerned he might do so in 8:38-39.

"But wait," some say. "If God is so loving, why would He send anyone to hell?" It's simple, He loves His creation so much that He doesn't make any of them choose to love Him back. True love allows that choice. So, God even lovingly allows His creation to separate themselves from Him, if they desire. Thus, those who reject God willfully embrace their own eternal separation from God, choosing intensifying sin and its end product, an eternal hell. Yet, God, even knowing in advance who will receive or reject Him, continues to reach out His love to the entire world, so that anyone who would receive His love in Christ Jesus would be saved, sanctified, and become a son of God!

The amazing thing here is that, if we have truly accepted this love of God for ourselves in Christ, nothing can take that love away. This is the same truth as how nothing or no one can take the Holy Spirit from believers in Christ (Jn. 14:6, Eph. 1:13). Nothing I've done or could ever do would change His love for me, nor go beyond the ability of Christ's blood to cover it all. God's love is a constant, unending flow. Even when we don't "feel" His love, the truth is, He Loves Us Tremendously Because His Word Says So. It's a love beyond our knowledge. Ephesians 2:7 even says that it will take "ages" (I assume a gazillion years) for us to comprehend such love. Wow.

Have you ever been truly gripped by God's love, like Paul is in these last 2 verses of Romans 8? Wow, such love truly changes us. The deeper we dive into the love of God for us, the stronger, more confident, more caring, more happy, and more useful we become.

Sermon Review

"Time For The Big Boy Pants" from Psalm 26-42

This past week was difficult as believers in America, watching just how wicked our society has become and seeing Christians, like Charlie Kirk, martyred for preaching Biblical values. Yet the Psalms brought us heavenly help in assessing how we should think and live in light of such chaos. Surveying our psalms this week, we focused on 4 essential responses of the believer in light of this past week's events.

1)Dealing With Depravity With Mercy(Psalm 36). In Psalm 36:1-4, David considers the sinfulness of man, not fearing God, projecting hate, devising wickedness, and ruining each other. And while it's easy for us to point the finger at our world for these woes, the truth is we contribute to the sin problems being sinners! Romans 3 and 7 reminded us that there are none righteous, and that all have sinned. In our sin nature, we are all children of wrath, BUT God spared we who believe in His amazing mercy (Eph. 2:4-5, Titus 3:5). So, that's exactly where David leads the rest of Psalm 36, pleading for mercy for all men and calling them to seek God for it. Rather than reveling in so-called righteous indignation, we always do better training our hearts to show mercy as God has shown us so wonderfully in His Son!

2)Delighting ourselves in the Lord (Psalm 37:1-11) As a kingly coronation Psalm (likely for his son Solomon), David pleads for all not to be moved by wickedness when it comes, but to run to refuge in delighting in the Lord. These events can often take us off mission or mess with our view of God, when David shows them instead as opportunities to get close with God and back on His mission. I'm so proud of Erika Kirk, who showed us Saturday in her bold speech that a family on an earthly mission fueled by an eternal hope in the Lord cannot be stopped! The love of the Lord radiated out of her, and He will certainly be her portion moving forward as she delights in Him. As David reveals in Psalm 37, we can delight in the Lord most when we trust in God's sovereign plans for our lives (37:5) and God's sovereign justice in His end-times plans (see 2 Thess. 1:5-9). Instead of drowning in news and sorrows, let's delight ourselves in the Lord!

3)Dare to discuss death. (Psalm 39) In Psalm 39:4-5, David writes to remind himself that his life is "but a vapor." And while we read this Psalm on the day Kirk was killed as a congregation, I pray we also learned the importance of wrestling/discussing the brevity of life. Truth is, for the believer, there is no fear in death! Rather, our death, when it comes, is ultimate gain (Phil. 1:21)! Conveying to our families about the brevity of life and our desire for heaven will help us not only prepare them for when tragedy strikes, but it can also help them heal in eternal, glorious hope. Life is certainly so fragile, but we have the answers to eternal life!

4)Proclaiming God's Praise (Psalm 40:1-5). We closed looking at Psalm 40:1-5, which shows David praising God with a new song of deliverance that "many will see and fear!" God allows dark seasons for amazing stories to be proclaimed! While many in tragedy will say, "Where is your God" (Psalm 42:3), we see Him at work everywhere when we declare His praises! Certainly He shows us (as we're seeing all over this country right now) as people come together to praise Him!
